

In 2022, Botswana welcomed 1.04 million international arrivals and is focused on growing that number this year through new source markets and increased airlift capacity. Intraregional travel is a growing trend, with five of Botswana's top-ten source markets located in Africa – namely South Africa, Zimbabwe, Zambia, Namibia, and Lesotho. Internationally, its key source markets are USA, Germany, United Kingdom, Australia and France.

African Bush Camp's new Khwai Lediba



African Bush Camps launched Khwai Lediba, along the Khwai River in the Khwai Concession earlier this year. The camp accommodates 16 guests in environmentally friendly luxury tented rooms including five double rooms, one honeymoon suite, and one family suite. Each unit features an ensuite bathroom with both indoor and outdoor showers. The honeymoon and family units also include a bath tub and private deck equipped with daybeds. The camp's central building houses a pool, a dining area with an open kitchen, a large pizza oven, and a bar. Other facilities include several decks and lounging areas, a shaded and secluded pool and a fire pit on the lower deck. Guests can enjoy morning, afternoon, and evening game drives, as well as walking and mokoro (canoe) safaris when water levels allow. Great Plains' new Sitatunga Private Island

Great Plains launched Sitatunga Private Island in mid July 2023, located in the Okavango Delta. Built on a raised railway sleeper private deck, using the wood from old railway tracks, Sitatunga Private Island can host up to eight guests in two four-person suites and an additional four adults or family of two adults and three children in a spacious two-bedroom unit. Each of the suites boasts an indoor lounge, well-furnished bathrooms, a private deck and an outdoor pool providing panoramic lagoon views. The camp's design, driven by Great Plains' Dereck and Beverly Joubert, is an ode to the Okavango's history and the Bayei people. It is one of the few locations in the world where one can still see the sitatunga, a rare aquatic antelope, from camp and by boat. Activities at Sitatunga encompass boating safaris, mokoro rides, walking safaris, game drives and even private helicopter tours of the delta. For relaxation, guests have access to in-room massages, yoga mats, exercise equipment, a wine cellar and a boutique. The camp also offers a professional camera set for guests. Natural Selection's new Botswana camps

Natural Selection has launched two new properties in a 220,000-acre swath of private "NG12" concession in the northern Okavango Delta. Duke's Camp opened in June 2022, comprising eight canvas tents on raised wooden decks on Kgao Island. In May 2023, they added "Duke's East", a small sister camp with just 4 luxury tents – 3 double and 1 family room.

Both camps are picturesquely located on the water, only about 500 meters apart, but operate independently of each other. Duke's East is ideal for exclusive use by multi-generational families or small groups - but can also be booked individually. Activities include game drives and traditional mokoro (a dugout canoe) safaris. They also launched a new high-end camp North Island Okavango in June 2023 in NG23A, just to the north-west of both Duba Plains and Vumbura. The camp comprises just three premier tents, one very private island and a hive of year-round safari activities to choose from.

Mashatu's two new Safari Homes

Located on the banks of the Limpopo River, Kolokolo is a luxurious, 5-star, newly renovated safari home designed for exclusive-use. Atzaró Okavango coming in March 2024



Atzaró Okavango will be launching in March 2024, set within a 1,100-sq-km private concession by Moremi Game Reserve. Kavango Zambezi Transfrontier Area - KAZA

The Kavango Zambezi Transfrontier Area (KAZA) is the world's largest terrestrial Transfrontier Conservation Area (TFCA) at approximately 520 000sqkm. Occupying part of the Okavango and Zambezi river basins, it encompasses areas within the borders of Angola, Botswana, Namibia, Zambia and Zimbabwe, and includes 36 formally proclaimed protected areas made up of a host of game reserves, forest reserves, game/wildlife management areas, community conservancies and conservation and tourism concession areas designated for use of natural resources. The most well-known components of KAZA are the Chobe National Park, Hwange National Park, Kafue National Park, the Makgadikgadi Pans, the Okavango Delta and Victoria Falls. KAZA is the world's largest wildlife conservation area and is home to the greatest concentration of free-roaming savannah elephants in Africa. Botswana unveils first cable car project

Cable Cars Botswana (CCB) has revealed ambitious plans for the installation of cable cars in the southern region of Gaborone, atop the scenic Kgale Hill. The cable cars will offer an exciting urban adventure, providing visitors with panoramic views of Gaborone and its surroundings. It will connect the Game City Mall, a kilometre from the proposed upper station, which is 1.2 km above sea level. The proposed Cabrio system from Switzerland is expected to transport about 60 tourists per trip, with 30 on the upper deck and 30 in the lower chamber. The lower station will feature a coffee shop and ticket booth, and the upper station will have a revolving restaurant, a sky bridge, an infinity pool, a gym, curio shops, a conference centre and an event park. The additional facilities are designed to enhance tourism and enliven the capital city. Construction is scheduled to commence in early 2025.

FlyCemAir launched second service to Botswana

South African domestic and regional carrier FlyCemAir launched a service to Kasane in September 2023. The two weekly non-stop flights operate on Wednesdays and Saturdays between ORTambo International Airport (JNB) in Johannesburg and Kasane International Airport (BBK). Kasane International Airport is about 4km south of Kasane in Botswana's Chobe District. It provides access to Chobe National Park and serves as the second airport for tourists travelling to the Victoria Falls – both on the Zambian and Zimbabwean sides – and Katima Mulilo in Namibia. The airline also offers a service to Maun International Airport.

Airlink opens offices in Botswana

Regional airline Airlink, opened country offices in Gaborone to enhance customer services and meet the strong demand for travel to Maun and the Okavango Delta. Airlink's Gaborone team comprises two staff and Airlink's Country Manager. Airlink operates up to 50 return flights a week to Gaborone, Maun and Kasane.
